

Judge Steven E. Gall was sworn in as Judge on the Cuyahoga County Court of Common Pleas, General Division on December 4, 2012.

Judge Gall is a graduate of Strongsville High School. He attended Cleveland State University where he earned a B.B.A. degree in Management\Labor Relations. During law school at Cleveland-Marshall College of Law, Judge Gall interned with the City of Brunswick, Ohio Law Department as a Law Clerk. He also clerked for the Cleveland law firm of Gold, Rotatori, Schwartz and Gibbons. Upon passing the bar in 1991, he served as an Assistant Prosecutor for the Cities of Brunswick and Strongsville during which time he established a private law practice. As a private attorney, he handled a variety of legal matters including personal injury, domestic relations/family law and general defense work.

In 1999, Judge Gall was hired as an Assistant Prosecuting Attorney for Cuyahoga County. His work in the CCPO included the Juvenile Division, General Felony Division, Grand Jury Division, Community Based Division and the Major Trial Unit where he primarily prosecuted homicide (including death penalty cases) and sexual assaults. He handled over 180 of these cases while in this unit. As an Assistant Prosecutor, Judge Gall has argued cases before the 8th District Court of Appeals and the Ohio Supreme Court. He was the past Chairman of the Parma Police Civilian Review Board.

Judge Gall resides in Parma, Ohio with his wife. Judge and Mrs. Gall are members of the Parma Area Chamber of Commerce and further serve the community as volunteers at the Achievement Centers for Children at Camp Cheerful in Strongsville.
