

# **Colonel Chief Eliot K. Isaac**

## **Cincinnati Police Department**

Colonel Eliot K. Isaac was appointed Police Chief of the Cincinnati Police Department on December 10, 2015 as Cincinnati's 15<sup>th</sup> police chief. Hired in 1988, Eliot Isaac is a 26 year veteran of the Cincinnati Police Department. Chief Isaac's background and experience brings a wealth of knowledge to bolster CPD's law enforcement presence and community engagement efforts.

His experience spans virtually every aspect of policing including: administration, patrol command, internal investigations, problem solving, and community engagement.

Chief Isaac was promoted to Executive Assistant Police Chief in July of 2015. Prior to becoming the Assistant Police Chief, Chief Isaac served as the Criminal Investigation Commander where his responsibilities included oversight of all types of investigations such as homicides, rapes or personal crimes, and financial crimes.

From 2007 to 2012 he served as the District Four Commander where he spearheaded several initiatives which significantly reduced shootings and homicides in one of Cincinnati's busiest and most violent districts. He also served as the Internal Investigations Section Commander and Department Night Chief. Chief Isaac became a police captain in 2004 where he spent most of his time working in District Four.

Chief Isaac holds a Bachelor's Degree in Organizational Leadership from Xavier University and is currently pursuing a Master's Degree in Xavier's Human Resources Development from Xavier.

Chief Isaac is very involved with the *HOPE worldwide* organization which is committed to changing the lives individuals through community-based services to the poor and needy. He is married with two daughters and currently lives in Forest Park, Ohio.
