WHEREAS, Ohio Governor Mike DeWine on April 27, 2020, with modifications on April 28, 2020, issued “COVID-19 Responsible Protocols for Getting Ohio Back to Work” (hereafter “Governor’s Orders”);

WHEREAS, Governor DeWine, as part of his Governor’s Orders, issued mandates for General Office Environments (hereafter “General Office Mandates”);

WHEREAS, the Supreme Court of Ohio released the Responsible Restart Ohio Court Access guidance dated May 7, 2020 (hereafter “Supreme Court Guidance”);

WHEREAS, Supreme Court Guidance states, in part, all courts must establish policy to require face coverings for employees and the public;

WHEREFORE, the Court **ORDERS** as follows:

1. All employees of the Seneca County Juvenile and Probate Court shall wear a facial coverings consistent with General Office Mandates.
2. All persons providing a service within the Seneca County Juvenile and Probate Court courtrooms and conference rooms, including but not limited to maintenance, cleaning, technical support, shall wear a face covering at all times.

3. All members of the public, including attorneys, entering the Seneca County Juvenile and Probate Court Courtrooms and Conference rooms shall wear a facial covering and abide by State of Ohio social distancing guidelines. Exceptions to this policy may be granted by the Judge if facial coverings are not advisable for health reasons.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
